JANUARY 1958. One thing which makes the Escuela Agricola Panamericana unusual is that all of our 160 students come on a full scholarship. This results in our having a complete cross-section of Latin American life, students from all types of families, as well as some 13 nationalities.

The most striking, immediate result is that we probably have more boys trying to enter this school than does any other school in Latin America. Thus, this year we have 21 qualified applicants taking our competitive examinations for each scholarship we offer!

Our selection must be carefully made on the basis of not only intelligence and interest in agriculture, but also on the basis of personality and (that almost impossible unknown!) probability that he will contribute to the agriculture of his country after graduation.
