


the 27th, accompanied by Miss Mary Quinlan who is running the new American School in Tegucigalpa.

On the 28th and 29th we had the pleasure of showing the school to a group of ten Guatemalans, eight of whom are members of the Agricultural Committee, while the other two are agricultural officials of the government. This group showed unusual interest in our livestock work and in new crops. They took home seeds and plants of several things, and expressed a desire to build up further collaboration between the school and the agricultural institutions in Guatemala.

During the month, Mr. Lee Adams and Mr. J. H. Heuer and family resigned to return to the United States. Mr. W. C. Jones, who had been on loan from Tela Railroad Company, returned to Tela and Sr. Ramon Alvarez C and Miguel Angel Vasquez, both of Tegucigalpa, were added to the staff of the Business Office.

All of the necessary equipment for installation of second 37.5 KVA hydro-electric unit has arrived and construction of addition to present light plant building was started during the first part of the month. Steel pipe is also on hand for replacing temporary wood stave pipe in penstock. This change-over will be made during time plant is stopped to insert wye for second unit. Our portable saw-mill equipment has also arrived and will be set up during September.
